Letter from the Public Health Administrator

In 2021, the Health Department continued to work hard in our fight against COVID-19. We launched a vaccination campaign for all that were eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. We did this as a continuation of our partnership with the Cudahy and Oak Creek Health Departments in a Zone E response. We held vaccination clinics in a variety of settings in an effort to increase ease of access for all to receive the vaccine. This included providing home visits for vaccinations which we do every year for Influenza vaccines but this year we added COVID -19 vaccines.

As the year moved forward, we saw cases ebb and flow with new variants that presented challenges but we continued to complete disease investigation, guidance for isolation and quarantine, testing, and vaccinations.

We also had the opportunity to participate in outdoor functions within the communities including the St. Francis Concert in the Park, and National Night Out, South Milwaukee Downtown Market, and Community Night Out.

The Health Department sponsored Versiti Blood Drives in collaboration with the South Milwaukee Lions Club in an effort to increase donations during a national shortage due to the pandemic.

A big “Thank you” goes out to all of our wonderful volunteers who assisted us with our community vaccination clinics and vision screening, we could not have done it without you.

Notable Heroes in Health Care: South Shore Health Departments

The South Milwaukee/St. Francis, Cudahy and Oak Creek municipal health departments have been working together on COVID-related initiatives since the beginning of the pandemic. Partnerships included a drive-thru testing clinic in South Milwaukee's downtown, multiple traveling vaccination clinics and a standing vaccination clinic at the former Kmart store in Cudahy. These projects were all executed while simultaneously conducting disease investigation, responding to citizen questions, enforcing local orders within the respective communities and continuing regular health programming. Staffing included an all-hands-on-deck approach and the hiring of temporary employees to account for additional responsibilities, said Patrick Brever, assistant city administrator for South Milwaukee.
